Summary

Alena Kozakova is a Director at E.CA. She leads E.CA Economics' London office with Bas Dessens. Her expertise lies in competition and regulation economics. Alena has private and public experience. She has led competition cases, such as mergers, antitrust and damages, in the UK, German and EU proceedings, including on appeal and through Courts. She has also managed regulatory decisions, including on appeal.

Alena has extensive experience in applied microeconomics, particularly industrial organisation. She has seen a broad variety of cases with particular emphasis on retail, telecoms, utilities and platform competition. Alena also has expertise in applying competition economics in industries with a history of weak market organisation, such as healthcare, public service broadcasting and education, and in applying regulatory microeconomics and finance.

Prior to joining E.CA, Alena was the Chief Economist of the UK water regulator, Ofwat. She also worked for both predecessors of the UK's Competition and Markets Authority (Office of Fair Trading and the Competition Commission) and for DG Competition within the European Commission. a Alena also worked for Frontier Economics.

Alena holds a master's degree in economics from the University of Economics in Prague and from City University in London. She holds master's degrees from the Institute d'études politiques de Paris and the École nationale d'administration.
